Your club continues to invest back into our trail system. 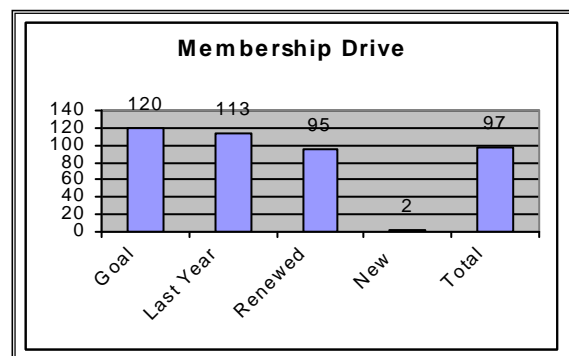
Besides the fun of riding together and the fellowship, the Dinner Ride also gives us an

DINNER RIDE

Eva Gnad reported that the date is set for the Dinner Ride Event on February 7, 2008 at Walkers Bay Supper Club. Discussion was made as to where we should make reservations while on our ride for a lunch break. It was tabled until the date gets closer to determine if there will be snow to ride this year. Bucket raffles will be used again this year. Volunteers are needed to go to businesses in the area and solicit items for the raffle. If any members have anything for raffle they are encouraged to bring them to the January meeting. A motion was made by Jerry Frey for Eva Gnad to use the \$100.00 we received as donations to purchase items to be used in the bucket raffle. Tony Gnad seconded motion. Motion approved. We will again be raising funds for the Brazeau Rescue Squad.

MEMBERSHIP

A report was given by Roy Lawrenz that our membership stands at 88 families with one new member. Last year we ended the season with 113 memberships. Roy calculated that roughly 25% of our membership is active membership. Roy also reported on some of the responses he received in last months mailings.

LANDOWNER PERMISSION SLIPS

Insurance paperwork was sent out last week to land owners and the townships will be sent out today. Roy read off the landowners who needed to be added or dropped from our insurance. Secretary Debbie Baumberger will be making the changes to our policy.

MAP SPONSORSHIPS

Map ads are completed with the County. The new maps are going to print on Monday.

CHAIN SAW

Roy purchased a chain saw, case, oil and gas can. Price \$313.00.

WAYSIDES ON TRAILS

Ron Tank, owner of Tanks Tavern is in agreement to have a campfire pit out behind his tavern and will provide wood for the fire. This will be on his private land. Burn permits are not needed. Chili, pizzas and hot chocolate will be available in the tavern for purchase. A motion was made by Mike Lambert to go forward and establish this turn around on the trail with Ron Tank. Bob Berns seconded the motion. Motion approved. Dale Behnke will work with Ron

Tank to get a vinyl sign to hang and advertise and alert people of the intended use.

WELCOME SIGNS

Project is complete. All signs are hung. The club gave Andy Baker a round of applause for all his effort in developing this project and seeing it thru to completion. This is going to be a wonderful addition to our trail system.

TRAIL REPORTS

Jerry Frey – Some cleanup to do, have some major chain saw work to be done today, and still needs to check out the Rost Lake area. Scott Thomsen land will be closed until Jan 6th. Temporary signs will be needed on Parkway Rd and Lee Lake Rd. Gerry Frey and Tom Stadler will check with Scott to see which way would be more beneficial for him.

Bert Wiedemeier – Trails are ok to go.

Gene Duffy – White Potato Lake area still needs to be marked. Gene will be unable to mark trails. Volunteers were coordinated at the meeting to start this project.

Tom Stadler – Brush cutting by the Golf Course. A couple of lots will be going up for sale by Round Lake which may or may not affect current trail.

Andy Baker – Will be working on trails all day today but will finish today.

GRADING

Mark Kuchta our groomer informed us that he worked 48 hours grading our trail section of the Pipeline and we shouldn't have to run Pipeline road. All holes have been graded and hills are now smooth. Mark had purchased a drag just for this type of work. Bob Skalitsky the County Rep called and commented how unbelievable the pipeline was. A motion was made by Gerry Frey to reimburse Mark \$1998.00 for labor that was done above and beyond his normal grading. Bert Weidemeir seconded the motion. Motion carried. Future discussions will be made by the club for any additional work that may be done by Mark to include time and material payments. A round of applause was given to Mark for purchasing the grader.

A motion to adjourn the meeting at 10:20 A.M. was made by Jerry Frey and seconded by Don Wittman. Motion approved.
